

- Habitat for Humanity International has more than 1,400 affiliates in all 50 states of the United States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the territory of Guam and in more than 70 other countries around the world.
- Habitat houses are sold at no profit to partner families, financed with no-interest mortgages. House payments go into a revolving Fund for Humanity that is used to build more Habitat houses.



- Habitat for Humanity's criteria for selecting homeowners are based on three principles:
 - Need for adequate shelter.
 - Ability to pay the mortgage.
 - Willingness to partner.
- Homeowner families are required to invest "sweat-equity" labor hours in the construction of their houses.
- By the end of fiscal year 2014, Habitat for Humanity had built, rehabilitated or repaired more than 1 million houses worldwide, helping 5 million people obtain decent, affordable shelter.
- Expenses for Habitat for Humanity houses are kept low through donations from individuals, corporations, churches, foundations and through the use of volunteer labor.
